


Phase I Regional Rail Stations

Developing rail service includes the identification of locations throughout a region or community to which many people, particularly commuters, need or choose to travel. These locations or activity generators may be selected as transit stations. In the Triangle Region, our activity generators include the downtowns, major employment centers, residential areas, the airport, universities and other institutions, medical facilities, sports, dining, entertainment and shopping centers.

The locations proposed for the 16 Phase I Regional Rail Stations are major activity generators which also have the ability to support regional growth at higher levels of development intensity. In fact, based on existing development trends, with modest shifts in development facilitated by transit supportive land use policies and enhanced mobility, forecasts indicate that by 2020 over 50% of the Triangle Region's population and 75% of its employment will be within 3 miles of the Regional Transit Stations.

How do you get to and from the Stations?

People are likely to access the regional rail stations from home or work in different ways, depending on the distance that separates them from the station.

- ▶ Walking, bicycling, using a wheelchair or taking a shuttle if they are within about 1/2 mile of the station
- ▶ Using a shuttle or feeder bus if they live or work nearby, but beyond comfortable walking or wheelchair distance, usually about a mile from the station
- ▶ Using the existing local bus service, coordinated to provide neighborhood access to the rail stations if they are within a mile or more of the station
- ▶ Being dropped off at the station by a relative or friend - kiss and ride
- ▶ Driving to the stations and using the park and ride lot
- ▶ No matter how they travel, most people will be pedestrians for some part of each trip
